The Finn River Basin

Negotiating Boundary Crossing Water Management Agreements

This is a seven-party, seven-person, multi-issue negotiation role play simulation involving a dispute over interprovincial water allocations. It explores issues of prediction and monitoring, water sharing, and the environmental adequacy of water flows. The game introduces a mutual gains approach (MGA) to negotiation and highlights the benefits of a more collaborative, non-zero sum, approach to managing boundary waters.

The General Instructions for the role play have been included in your welcome folder. Please ensure you review these in advance of the simulation exercise.
